<b>Preparedness</b>	Student is completely prepared and has obviously rehearsed.	Student seems pretty prepared but might have needed a couple more rehearsals.	The student is somewhat prepared, but it is clear that rehearsal was lacking.	Student does not seem at all prepared to present.
<b>Volume</b>	Volume is loud enough to be heard by all audience members throughout the presentation, INCLUDING the back of the classroom! Volume often too soft to be heard by all audience members.
<b>Content</b>	Shows a full understanding of the topic.	Shows a good understanding of the topic.	Shows a good understanding of parts of the topic.	Does not seem to understand the topic very well.
<b>Speaks Clearly</b>	Speaks clearly and distinctly all (100-95%) the time, and mispronounces <i>few</i> words.	Speaks clearly and distinctly all (100-95%) the time, but mispronounces <i>some</i> words.	Speaks clearly and distinctly most (94-85%) of the time. Mispronounces many words.	Often mumbles or can not be understood OR mispronounces too many words.
<b>Enthusiasm</b>	Facial expressions and body language generate a strong interest and enthusiasm about the topic in others.	Facial expressions and body language sometimes generate a strong interest and enthusiasm about the topic in others.	Facial expressions and body language are used to try to generate enthusiasm, but seem somewhat faked.	Very little use of facial expressions or body language. Did not generate much interest in topic being presented.
<b>Posture and Eye Contact</b>	Stands up straight, looks relaxed and confident. Establishes eye contact with everyone in the room during the presentation.	Stands up straight and establishes eye contact with everyone in the room during the presentation.	Sometimes stands up straight and sometimes establishes eye contact.	Slouches and/or does not look at people during the presentation.
<b>Time-Limit</b>	Presentation is 15-20 minutes long.	Presentation is 13-15 minutes long, OR 20-22 minutes long	Presentation is 11-13 minutes long OR 22-24 minutes long	Presentation is less than 11 minutes OR longer than 24 minutes.
<b>Power Point Presentation</b>	Presentation has no grammatical mistakes, is clean and informative but not distracting.	Presentation has one or two grammatical mistakes, is informative but somewhat distracting.	Presentation has many mistakes, is not very informative or is distracting.	Presentation has too many mistakes, does not contribute to the students' oral presentation.
